5.1 Planning, Development & Compliance Matters

Bayside's Coordinator Development Assessment, Christopher Mackey was present for this matter.

Planning, Development and Compliance matters were tabled for discussion with the BHT Executive.

- 1. DA-2023/45 1015 1019 Botany Road, Mascot:
 - Development of shops opposite Mascot Memorial Park: The height limit is 14 metres (3 stories).
 - There are heritage considerations from the shops/buildings that are the subject to planning controls.
- 2. Update on Marina Theatre re-development:
 - No progress on building works to date.
 - Chris Mackey to confirm lapse date of consent.
- 3. DA-2023/209 686 Botany Rd Mascot:
 - No issues raised by BHT.
- 4. DA-2023/199 19 Boussole Rd, Daceyville:
 - Council's heritage architect asked that the developer comply with heritage colours.
- 5. DA-2023/264 18 Cook Ave, Daceyville:
 - Proposal to build another story and a carport at the rear which will require removal of some large trees.
- 6. DA-2023/291 63 Tenterden Rd, Botany
 - No issues raised by BHT.
- 7. Demolition of façade at Banksmeadow shops on La Perouse Road
 - The current modification before the NSW Land and Environment Court is ongoing and likely the applicant/developer will submit amended plans to the Court for an entirely new façade.
 - No further update from Compliance team regarding any action taken to date.
- 8. Councillor Muscat enquired if there were any development on the re-use of the former Botany Police Station
 - Christopher Mackey advised that there is no update yet from NSW Government.

Summary

An overview of activities relating to Local History by Bayside Council Local History Librarians in the past three months.

Officer Recommendation

That the BHT Executive note the report.

Background

Local History Research Requests

From 1 October to 31 December 2023 there were 75 Local History research requests: 22 complex, 21 medium and 32 simple requests. Twenty of the requests related to the former Botany LGA. A complex enquiry takes more than three hours to answer.

Digitisation of Local History AV items - update

The listing of t103 VHS, Betamax, Umatic and 8mm video tapes in the collection has been completed. Five quotes for their digitisation were sought and they are currently being digitised by Bowline Media.

Collection storage - update

- AMAC House is due to be demolished in July 2024, as part of the re-development of the Botany Aquatic Centre. Bayside Council is investigating alternative storage locations. As previously advised, the Botany RSL sub-branch will need to find a new home for their archives, which are stored there.
- Wendy Thorp from Cultural Resources Management has been commissioned to undertake a significance assessment of the Sir Joseph Banks Hotel archaeological collection that is currently stored at AMAC House. This will assist in determining which parts of this collection should be retained and moved to a new location.

Exhibitions and displays - update

The Home Sweet Home: Botany and Mascot 1920s - 1960s exhibition has been extended until 1 June 2024 to allow local history staff time to work on the relocation of items from AMAC House.

From June-September 2024, there will be an exhibition of some of the winning entries in the recent Bayside Council photographic competition, along with historical images of the same sites.

From October 2024 – July 2025, there will be an exhibition about Botany's industrial heritage. This coincides with an exhibition at the Hurstville Museum and Gallery about former industries in the Georges River region and opens an opportunity for some join public programs.

All ideas for future exhibition topics are welcome.

Events and projects

- The launch of the *Home Sweet Home* exhibition was held on Saturday 28th October. Cr Jo Jansyn represented the mayor, 40 people attended.
- The Nancy Hillier Memorial Lecture was held at the Botany Town Hall on 2 November 2023. The Local History team prepared a display for the event, as well as producing a poster explaining Nancy Hillier's life and achievements that can be used in future events.
- A display of the former Botany Mayoral Chains and chair is currently being prepared for Botany Town Hall. The Chair will be on display in the foyer of the town hall from March and the mayoral chains from May 2024.
- The Christmas issue of the BHT newsletter was produced and distributed. Additional printed copies are available.
- The BHT Christmas party was held on 11 December 2023. 53 people attended including staff, BHT members and The Hon. Ron Hoenig.

Donations

 Christine Moss, a BHT member and former resident of Luland Street, Botany, donated 60 items as a result of the *Home Sweet Home* exhibition. These items have all been photographed, listed for cataloguing and rehoused for long-term storage and current or future display.

Ron Rathbone Local History Competition

• Planning is underway for this year's Local History Competition, which is expected to open in March.

 Bayside Library Service's Graduate, Dean Palmer, will be assisting with Local History projects for the next three months.
